Forklift Seats - A seat is a strong, strong surface to be seated, typically raised above floor level. Usually used by one individual, most seats are supported by four legs, although some may be in a triangular shape using only three legs. A stool is a kind of seat that does not have a back or any arm rests. A seat which has folding action and an inclining footrest is referred to as a recliner, whereas a seat along with arms only is considered an arm seat. When a seat has attached wheels, it can be referred to as a wheelseat and if the seat is hung from above, it is called a swing. A permanently connected seat in a theatre or a train is called a seat or airline seat, yet when riding; it is a saddle as in bicycle saddle. A car seat is the type used in vehicles and an infant car seat would be a seat particularly intended for young kids.

The design of the seat can differ rather considerably to accommodate various requirements and aesthetic tastes. As an example, designs could be decorated with drilled holes, can comprise gaps or low backs for ventilation or be made of porous materials. The seat back may be designed as an included headrest by way of extending the height above the occupant's head. Seats can be constructed with an attached, built in footrest or come with a separate matching ottoman. An ottoman is a short stool that is designed to be used as a movable footrest. Sometimes the ottoman can be mounted to a glider chair with swing arms, enabling the ottoman to rock back and forth along with the glider similar to a rocking chair along with a built-in footrest.

Seat covers are temporary textile covers used for a seat that could offer protection against wear and add beauty. A huge range of seat covers from leather to neoprene are now obtainable. More formal materials could be rented for events such as weddings to improve the decor. Some seat covers have decorative seat ties or bows connected to be tied at the rear of the seat in a decorative know or bow. Several folks make use of customized clear plastic furniture covers in order to protect their expensive seats and sofas.

Seat pads are cushions designed for seats, frequently decorative; they may even be used in vehicles to increase the drivers' height. Orthopaedic backrests offer support for the back, often in lumbar or lower spine region. Various producers have their seat pad designs patented and are recognized by certain medical organizations. A few of the newer car seats available are equipped together with built-in and adjustable lumbar supports in order to offer extra comfort to riders and drivers of the motor vehicle.
